The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards Quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year -

PLAN OF ACTION: 2006-07:

Following are the un-utilised plan of action of session 2005-06 which will be fulfilled in the session 2006-07.

- 1. To have a better Library facility IQAC proposes to offer reprographic facilities at the central Library.
- 2. IQAC has plan to make arrangement to apply to UGC for organizing National Seminar under the auspices of different Departments.
- IQAC proposes to apply to the UGC for organizing remedial classes with UGC grants which not yet received.
 - IQAC has plan to introduce vocational certificate course on Sericulture, Tailoring,
 Knitting & Cutting etc. to have a professional access to the poor and needy students.

New Plan of action 2006-07:

- IQAC proposes to construct new and separate Administrative Block and Teacher's Common Room with separate Departments.
- 6. To have a better academic environment IQAC proposes to construct a separate Block for Library buildings, for easy access for the student.
- 7. IQAC has plan to give training to the student by the faculty members to develop their skill of personality development.
- 8. IQAC proposes to hold a regular programme on Entrepreneur Development for the student in the summer vacation period through the guidance of reputed Entrepreneur of the city to enhance the eagerness of the student in the field of trade & commerce.
- 9. For the session IQAC of the college has a plan to developed Linkage with the society of the area through various schemes. It also offers to adopt a village as "Model Village' for the institution.
- 10. Lastly, for Quality enhancement of the student IQAC proposes to ascertain minimum 60% attendance in the class room activities for general course and 75% attendance for major course student.

Outcome achieved by the end of the year :

1. As per the proposal of IQAC of Goreswar College, reprographic facility has been provided in the Central Library. It has been provided by the BTAD authority.

- UGC, North East Regional Office has allotted National Seminar to Goreswar College on the topic "Autonomy & Ethnic Demography in the North-East-A Futuristic projection" as per the proposal made by IQAC through Seminal Cell.
- 3. For organising remedial classes the college has duly applied to UGC.
- 4. To introduce the vocational courses in certain subjects the college has applied to the authority of Gauhati University as per their rules and Guidelines.
- 5. For construction of new and separate Administrative Block and Teaching Departments the college applied for grants to various funding agencies.
- 6. For a separate Library Block the BTAD authority has already sanctioned Rs. 10,00,000.00 (Rupees ten lakh) for the construction for a better academic environment.
- 7. For Personality Development of the student the Education Department is offering voluntary services as per the proposal of IQAC.
- 8. IQAC of Goreswar College is holding part time programme on Entrepreneur development for the student guided by two Faculty member namely Mr. K.K. Das and Mrs. G. Kalita who are trained person of IIE, Guwahati.

Out of these 10 segments identified by the IQAC the college has fully and partially fulfilled 8 segments. The remaining 2 segments will be fulfilled in the next session in priority basis.

i). Progress Report of Academic Cell:

More or less each and every academic function of Goreswar College is guided by Academic Cell. The members of the Academic cell use to have atleast one sitting in a week. The cell use to evaluate the on going routine, the internal progress of the various Departments, the constructive revision of the syllabus, supervision of the tutorial classes.

Apart from this, the Academic cell regularly published the Academic calendar of the college every year. The Academic cell is also empowered to give constructive suggestions to the various Departments for the positive upliftment of the quality Education of the student community of the college. It is also responsible to advice the various Deptts. in the matter of proper maintenance of the departmental activities along with the Academic matter.

ii). Progress Report of Extension Education Cell:

Under the guidance of Extension Education Cell of Goreswar College various steps has been taken to implement various projects in different sectors. To implement these programmes the concern cell use to collects its fund from the college authority and from the voluntary contributions from the teaching and office staff of Goreswar College.

The cell initiated the following programme -

Flood relief camp : On 12/10/06.

The Extension Education Cell of Goreswar College has executed another project on Flood Relief. The Flood Relief Camp was organised in village known as Ouguri under Goreswar Revenue Circle.

The Ouguri village was badly effected by flood and the members of the Extension Education Cell and along with other teachers and students of the college had gone to the flood effected area with an intention to help them according to the capacity by providing them certain materials like food, tripals, cloths etc.

iii). Progress Report of Student Welfare Cell:

A two day programme on 05/09/06.

Another two day workshop programme was also arranged in Goreswar College on 05/09/06. The subject matter of the workshop was "Juvenile deliquency in the present days".

During the workshop it was tried to introduce the students of Goreswar College with the different situations which can lead young generation towards the juvenile deliquency. Under what situation and circumstances a young man can involve with criminal activities and how it is possible to keep someone away from all these anti-social activities. This problems is usually seen particularly among the young people belonging to the age group of 14-20.

A renowned Psychologist Dr. Jayanta Das was invited to address the students. The invited guest had tried to give proper guidance to the college students of Goreswar College so that they can avoid this set of anti-social means.

iv). Progress Report of General Infrastructure Cell:

To maintain the overall looking of Infrastructural facility of course, Goreswar college has a General Infrastructural cell which is primarily responsible for the maintenance and development of infrastructural facility. In the continuous process the cell has convinced the college authority and applied for the grants for permanent building for Girls' Hostel, College Auditorium and also applied for many other construction. Through the infrastructure cell the college has received Rs. 20,000.00 (Rupees twenty lakhs) only from the Bodoland Territorial Council, which has developed

the infrastructural strength of the institution. So far the college has developed the ongoing construction of Auditorium Hall and Girls' Hostel to a great extent.

v). Progress Report of Statistical Cell:

The statistical cell of Goreswar College use to restore all kinds of statistical data concerning, the matters of examination, total student strength, strength of male and female students etc. The cell is responsible for the proper preservation of the data concerning all matters. Along with this the cell has to provide these data to all Departments and administrative staff when necessary.

vi). Progress Report of Career Counselling Cell:

Program on the use of Electronic Media as a means of Education (17.12.2006) :

A one day programme was organised to make the students aware of the various electronic means which can develop the educational activities of the students of Goreswar College.

Jiten Kakati was invited as the resource person. He had given a fruitful lecture on the use of internet service. How beneficial the electronic media and the computer devices in present time. It was also discussed that with the help of Electronic media the subject's of Syllabus can be made easy and interesting.

vii). Progress Report of Women Study Cell:

The women study cell of Goreswar College use to organize a numbers of programme at a regular interval in different themes and subject matters. The

programmes held under the guidance of women study cell use to try to keep in touch with women study concerning matters.

A survey Report:

The Women Study Cell of Goreswar College undertook a survey programme on 5.11.06 at village: Pukhuripar on the subject "Sanitation and Women Folk of rural areas". It was mainly an awareness camp to educate the rural women concerning health and sanitation. The survey team got a very good response from the area and the local people were too helpful and cordial.

viii). Progress Report of Allumni Association Cell:

The Allumni Association Cell of Goreswar College is entrusted upon to do some welfare activities to the student community and the college as a whole. The sale is gear up to collect fund from local bodies to construct a approach road from College to the market area. In this project the cell has a received a great response from the N.G.O. of Goreswar area and it is frequently helping the Association.

ix). Progress Report of Publication Cell:

Goreswar College has a publication cell and the main duty of the cell is to publish a Research oriented half yearly journal named "IMPRESSIONS". Through this journal the Faculty members uses to concentrate their research activities by writing articles, Report etc. So far the cell has brought out Four volume successfully to the readers and gained momentum in bringing out more volumes in recent times. Besides publication of IMPRESSIONS the cell is also engaged in other Literary task of various Departments. In the session 2006-07 the Publication Cell has brought out four wall

magazine of various Departments. In the next session the Cell will bring out the next volume of "IMPRESSIONS".

x). Progress Report of Seminar Cell:

The seminar cell of Goreswar College is endowed with the responsibility of organising interdisciplinary seminars and talks on various topics in collaboration with the departments concerned. The students, teachers and on some occasions teachers from the nearby institutions also participate in these seminars. The seminar cell although is envisaging to held National level seminars and the UGC Office have been offered proposal for the purpose with plans and estimates, the cell is yet to receive the required grant and approved in this regard. As such no National level seminar could be organised by the cell till date. The details of the seminars held under the various departments in collaboration with seminar cell in the session 2006-07 can be summarised as follows -

Seminar in the Deptt. of Assamese:

On 10.11.06 the Deptt. of Assamese organized another seminar entitled "Role of vaishnavism in Goreswar Area."

The topic of the seminar has its own relevance because a good numbers of people are now following vaishnavism. Many of the villages nearby Goreswar town is highly influenced by the ideals of Sankardeva.

In the seminar Dr. Anupama Deka, Sr, Lecturer of Chaygaon College was invited as the resource person. A very fruitful lecture was delivered by honourable resource person. A very fruitful lecturer was delivered by honourable resource person on the Role of Vaishnavism in Assamese Society.

Seminar Reports of the Deptt. of Bodo:

The Deptt. of Bodo organized another seminar entitled "The Growth and Development of Bodo Short Story" on 16.11.06 in cooperation with the seminar cell of Goreswar College.

Mr. Binanda Swargiary subject teacher of Deulkuchi H.S. School and Nailo-jailo Uzir presented their paper in the seminar on the related topic. Mr. Tulan Ch. Mochahary, Lecturer, Deptt,. of Bodo, L.O.D.K. College, Dhekiajuli was invited as the resource person to the seminar.

During the seminar stress was given in highlighting the fact that in what way the Bodo short stories are developing day by day. What type of changes have been seen among the Bodo short stories in the present time. The invited resource person delivered a very fruitful lecture, specially on the matter of comparison of short stories of present time and that of the past periods.

Seminar in the Deptt. of Economics:

The Department of Economics organised a seminar on 23rd July, 2006 in the Department in association with the seminar cell of Goreswar College. The title of Seminar was "Population and Environment." Dr. K.K. Barman, Prof. of Economics, Department of Gauhati University was invited as the resource person.

The title of the seminar has its great relevance in the present time because the growing rate of population is standing as a challenge in front of stable environmental situation. So, during the seminar a positive discussion was been held on the various points which are contributing towards the imbalancement of environment

and in the seminar it was also tried to discover certain remedial measures to protect the environmental balance.

Seminars in the Deptt. of Education:

The Department of Education organised a seminar with the collaboration of seminar cell of Goreswar College on 29.10.06.

"Examination Reform in Higher Education" was the title of the seminar. Dr. Dipali Dutta was invited as the resource person. She is a senior grade lecturer in Chaygaon College, Deptt. of Education. She delivered a very fruitful lecture by pointing out the various defects of the Education System in the present time and various measures to remove these defects.

The seminar topic had its own significance, because now a days, the whole education system is going through defective policy. So it is very necessary to try to find out the defects, so that certain positive steps could be taken to change the system.

Seminars of the Department of English:

The Deptt. of English of Goreswar College had the privilege of organizing a departmental seminar on 01/08/06 in co-operation with seminar cell.

The title of the seminar was "Literature and its relation to society." The Principal of Goreswar College was the President of the Seminar and Dr. Gautam Sarmah of Cotton College was the invited Resource person of the seminar. He chaired the seminar and presented an enlightening and resourceful paper on Shakespeare and his

literature. All the students and teachers of Goreswar College were present in the seminar.

Seminars in the Deptt. of History:

On 05.11.06 the Deptt. of History of Goreswar College organized a departmental seminar on the topic - "Economic Viability of Tourist-destination and its Influence in the Socio-Economic History" was presided over by the principal I/C. Dr. I.S. Mumtaza, Reader in the Deptt, of History of Gauhati University acted as the resource person in the seminar. Senior Lecturer of the Deptt. K.R. Borah, C.P. Tamuli and N. Kalita presented papers on the said Seminar and enumerated some major thrust areas of tourist destination in and around Goreswar.

Dr. Mumtaza offered a vital sketch on importance of tourism sector in the economic development of the region. She sought the help of NGO as well as government agencies to develop the much needed sector which has already played a vital role in other parts of India.

Seminars in the Deptt. of Political Science:

The Department of political Science had got the honour of organizing another departmental seminar entitled "Role of women in freedom movement of India". The seminar was executed by the concerned Deptt. in association with seminar cell of the college. Dr. Manirul Hussain was invited as a resource person to the seminar. The seminar was held on 02/09/06.

The seminar topic is very important, because the women section played a very crucial role in the freedom movement of India which has not given required

importance. The present day women should actually know about the contributions of the women of that time, which can be instrumental in inspiring the women of present time.

Seminars in the Deptt. of Philosophy:

A seminar was held, jointly by the Department of Philosophy and seminar cell of Goreswar College on the topic of "Universal Religion" on 06/09/06. Sri Mohan Ch. Deka, Head of the Deptt. of Pub-Kamrup College was the invited resource person.

Sri Debabrata Choudhury, the head of the Deptt., gave a introductory lecture on Universal Religion. He told that religious holds the key to the misery of existence. Honourable Resource person Sri Deka gave a fruitful lecture on the various religions and their motos. It was tried to highlight that religions may be different in name but the motos of every religion are the same, which can be identified as love, humanity, brotherhood, etc. The ultimate aim of all the religion is unity and integrity in every sphere of life of man. In the seminar, the concept of universal religion was tried to discussed from the point of Swami Vivekananda.

PROGRESS REPORT OF SUPPORT SERVICES OF VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS

Asomiya Sahitya Chora, Department of Assamese:

Asomiya Sahitya Chora is an integral part of the Deptt. of Assamese of Goreswar College. Like every year on 7th November, 2006, the Asomiya Sahitya Chora organized certain competitions which can develop the literal and cultural capability of the students of the college. During the programme a Quiz competition was also held in

the college premises which was supervised by Prof. Biren Bhatta, H.O.D. of Assamese Department.

Historical Study Centre, Department of History:

The team was lead by the Secretary and Vice-President Mr. N. Kalita and C.P. Tamuli respectively. Surya Pahar a confluence of three religions of the world is a historic site. are belong to 6th to 9th century. The sight has offered enormous scope for the study of ancient history. The place became a spot for ancient artisans to exhibit their skill and interest. The places presently are being undertaken by the Archeological Survey of India and exploring the monuments largely.

Political Forum, Department of Political Science:

The political Forum of Political Science Departments on 03/09/06 organized a popular talk on the topic of "Terroism in the North East India"

Dr. Jogen Kumar Das was invited a the appointed speaker to the meeting all the teachers and the students were participated in the talk. 22. Course in which student assessment of teacher's is introduced and the action taken on student feedbacks:

At the end of the academic season the college prepared an assessment of Teachers known as student feedback. In TDC IInd yr and in TDC IIIrd year the feedback is taken regularly. The Teachers are assessed under the following 10 point scale rating. After scrutinising the various attitudes of Teachers as rated by the student the average rating is taken into account. iv) Issue of certificates:

25. Increase in the infrastructural facility:

The auditorium is partly funded by UGC. A few class room is also constructed and renovated during the session which has boosted up the infrastructure capacity of the college.

26. Technology upgradation:

In the field of Technology upgradation the College is not able to do a remarkable development Because in the communication technology the area is not so much developed. Being situated in the foot hill of Bhutan, the remote area is deprived of latest communication technology such as Internet communication. Within a limited

scope the teaching Departments are taking the help of Audio- visual aid for better quality upgradation. In such a way, the teaching learning process in completed with the available technology.

27. Computer and Internet access and training to Teacher & the student:

The college has an active computer education cell and it is responsible in providing computer education of the faculty members and students. At Present a certificate in computer application is running on for the students. As well as the students the faculty members are also take part in the training course and acquainted with the computer education. But in the field of Internet connectivity there is no provision for internet access as the locality is remain out side the purview of internet Networks.

28. Financial aid of students:

As per the plan of IQAC, Goreswar college is providing financial aid to the poor and meritorious student. It offers free admission to 4 students in the session 2006-07. Apart from this they are also provided with free text Book and other study materials. Every years the college provides these kind of financial aid to the poor and meritorious students of the college.

29. Activities and support from the Allumni Association:

The activities and the support provided by the Allumni Association to the college is incorporated with the progress report of Allumni Association Cell.

30. Activities and support from the parent-Teacher Association:

As with last years plan and programme in this session also the Parent-Teacher Association uses to sit twice in the year on 9th January and 29th August and discuss many issues which are related with the Quality Education of the Institution. The Association responded positively to the plan and action of the institution and put forwarded their views and suggestions.
