# GORESWAR COLLEGE

## PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Goreswar College is the sole premier institute of Higher Education in the South-Eastern part of Baksa District. It was established on the 29th day of August, 1974 by a team of selfless and untiring social workers and lovers of education of the greater Goreswar locality. Betna Siksha and Krishi Unnayan Sangha (Betna Education And Agricultural Development Organisation) was a major pioneering force in the venture that provided funds to develop the required initial infrastructure for the college after it had functioned from temporary sites for sometime at the beginning. Started as an Arts College with the P.U. (pre-university, now Higher Secondary) course in 1974 with 116 students, it rose to the status of a Degree College in and from the session 1977-78 as per G.U. Order No.- Aff/cg/1/77 with its P.U. (now H.S.) programme still continued. The College was brought under Deficit system of Grants-in-Aid with effect from 1.9.81 as per Govt. of Assam, Director of Public Instruction' Order No. NC.G(A)RC-2/82/17 dated Kahilipara, the 22th July, 1982. Again the college was provincialised w.e.f. 1st December 2005 by the Govt. of Assam along with other Deficit System of Grants-in-Aid Degree Colleges. The College has obtained inclusion under 2(F) & 12(B) of the UGC Act. of 1956 vide UGC order no, F8-31/95(CPP-1) dated 8th April, 2003. Till the Session 2016-17 the College had two streams, now from the current session (2017-18) the College has introduced the TDC programme in the Science stream also with both Honours and regular courses. At present the College has been brought under Bodoland University w.e.f. the session 2017-18 (CBCS course) vide affiliation letter No. Bu/CUDC/Aff/08/2016/166 dated 1st June, 2017. The present enrolment of the College is around 2500.

### Location :

Goreswar College (Longitude 91°-30' East and latitude 26°-40' North) is situated in Betna Mauza in the South-Eastern part of Baksa District under Tamulpur Sub-Division. The Goreswar Area which is infact the feeder area of the College extends from Barnadi (river) in the East to Puthimari (river) in the West and from the foothills of Bhutan in the North to Muktapur in the South encompassing a geographical land area of 34875 sq. metre.

The area inherits a rich historical past known as it was, as the temporary Capital of the Kingdom of Arimatta, the legendary king of Kamrupa (12th century) to whose memory the Arimatta Garh or Baidyar Garh still stands near Batna of Goreswar. Arimatta who was from Gaur (Bengal) was known popularly as Gaureswar - a name from which the name of Goreswar is said to have been derived.

At present it is under BTC (Bodoland Territorial Council). Goreswar College thus reflects the hopes and aspirations for Higher Education of the developing people of a geographically far-flung area to the South-Est extreme of the District of Baksa.

Examination in Arts and Commerce respectively from A.H.S.E.C. or equivalent Board. The college has introduced Science stream in Degree level w.e.f.2017-18 session. Admission is open to those who have passed H.S. (Sc.) under A.H.S.E.C. or equivalent Board. The CBCS course is introduced by the Bodoland university from the current session.

**General Guideline :**

**Under Graduate Syllabus under Bodoland University**

1. Candidates having English Honours must opt either Hindi or MIL communication subject as AECC-1 (can't opt English Communication as AECC-1). Similarly, candidate having

- Honours in MIL/Hindi must opt English communication subject as AECC-1 (cann't opt MIL/Hindi as AECC-1).
2. Students of Regular course are not allowed to opt more than one Language subject as DSC.
  3. GE-1 and GE-2 and SEC-1 and SEC-2 for Arts and Commerce streams in both Honours and Regular are same courses.
  4. SEC-1 and SEC-2 for Science stream(both Physical and Life Sciences) in both Honours and Regular are same courses.
  5. Students of B.Sc., B.A. and B.Com. honours courses will have four Generic Elective (GE) papers of two subjects. Students will be allowed to choose GE course of any discipline.
  6. The students of Honours will be allowed to opt GE courses from two different disciplines, in each discipline students will have to study two Semesters continuously or all four GE courses can be opted by the students in one single discipline continuously.
  7. The students of regular course will study one single Discipline GE course in the 5th & 6th Semesters.
  8. Students of Regular Course will study same syllabus of SEC-I & SEC-II course offered to the Honours students. In the V & VI Semester Regular Course students will study SEC-III & SEC-IV courses separately.
  9. The students of Honours will not be allowed to study GE courses in its Core subject.
  10. The marks distribution of Science subjects are Theory -60 + Practical-20 + Internal Assessment -20 total 100 marks and for Arts and Commerce courses it will be Theory-80 + Internal Assessment-20 total 100 marks in each paper except AECC.
  11. Where there is a practical there will not be tutorial and vice-versa.
  12. Institute should evolve a system/policy about ECA/General Interest /Hobby/Sports/NCC/NSS/ related courses by their own.
  13. **Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)** : These courses are to be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands on training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each Institution/College has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization ,requirements, scope and need. However , in this case approval of Academic Council of the University is mandatory.

**“Some Important Points”**

**TDC SEMESTER SYSTEM, BODOLAND UNIVERSITY**

**Regulation:**

1. There will be six semesters covering 3 years in the Degree course.
2. More weightage is given to Internal Assessment ; 20% marks will be for Internal as-  
sessment/evaluation from total marks and 80% for External (end semester) evaluation .
3. It is mandatory for all students to appear in Sessional Examinations. The minimum  
mark for passing in each paper is 30% of the total marks.

4. Subject change and switch over cases from major to general course are allowed only after prior approval from the authority concerned.

5. Other details of regulations etc. regarding Examination & other allied / related matters will be intimated in due course as per B.U. guidelines /directives.

#### **Examination/Evaluation:**

1. Examination work shall be compulsory for all teachers.
2. The teachers concerned have been entrusted / are responsible for internal evaluation.
3. There shall be cluster of colleges as evaluation zones and all the major colleges will have evaluation zones .(G.U.)
4. The principals of the colleges shall be responsible for timely evaluation of answer scripts. (G.U.)
5. The existing spot evaluation system will continue.(G.U.)
6. Regulations governing examination/evaluation etc.from Bodoland University (B.U.) shall come into force in due course.

#### **ADMISSION PROCEDURE:**

a) Goreswar College has its Admission Committee constituted with Assistant/Associate Professor(s) of various departments which finalizes the matters relating to admission with the approval of the principal.

b) Prospectus and application forms for admission into the Higher Secondary and Three year Degree semester courses can be obtained from the College website [www.goreswarcollege.in](http://www.goreswarcollege.in) or College office during working hours after its proper notification. Online filling up of forms is mandatory.

c) No application will be accepted after the last date of submission of forms.

d) Students found absent on the date of admission shall forfeit his/her admission .

e) The date of interview and admission for different courses will be notified by the Admission Committee.

f) The admission is given strictly on merit basis.

g) There is provision for reservation of seats for the candidates belonging to the SC/ST/OBC/MOBC and physically challenged categories as per Govt. rules.

h) A candidate must produce the following documents in original at the time of documents verification.

i) Marksheet and Admit Card of the last qualifying examination.

ii) Two copies of recent passport size photographs.

iii) A certificate from the Head of institution last attended, testifying his/her Character.

iv) Caste certificate from the competent authority (wherever necessary).

v) Income Certificate of parents obtained from competent authority.

vi) Gap certificate from a First class gazetted officer.

vii) Selection Test for Honours Subject will be conducted by the concerned Department within seven days after the start of the classes .

### **EXAMINATIONS:**

Besides the final examination conducted by A.H.S.E.C and G.U. / Bodoland University the college holds internal examinations like Unit Test/Sessional Examination and Pre-Final Test. To conduct the examinations smoothly the college authority constitutes an Examination Committee with senior members from the teaching departments.

The Schedule of Internal/Sessional examination is held as per A.H.S.E.C/ University Academic Calender. (G.U.)

1. Unit Test I (for H.S. classes) in September/October 2017,
2. Pre-Final Tests (for H.S. classes) in the last week of December 2017.
3. Annual Examination for H.S. 1st year as announced by A.H.S.E.C.
4. H.S. and TDC end semester examinations (GU) as announced by A.H.S.E.C. & G.U. respectively.
5. Sessional Examination (B.A. & B.Com classes) (GU) in September, 2017 and February, 2018.
6. Examination schedules for the semester examinations under B.U. for B.A., B.Com. & B.Sc. programmes will be intimated/ notified in due course.

### **INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:**

1. Internal Assessment of students in semester system for each paper is mandatory (Major & General /Honours & Regular) as per Gauhati University/Bodoland University guidelines.
2. Marks for internal assessment will be awarded on the basis of students' performance

in the Sessional examination(s). In each paper at least one Sessional Examination will be held during the academic session.

### ACADEMIC RESOURCES AND FACILITIES:

#### Library:

The Central Library of the College has at Present a stock of 36,226 books. The working hours of the library is from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. It has a good collection of books both syllab-prescribed and other reference books. The library endeavours to meet the needs of text books for economically backward students. Apart from the text books and reference books the library provides several newspapers and journals on science and humanities. To provide better facilities the library has reading rooms separately for students and teachers with sitting accommodation for 50 and 20 readers respectively at a time. At present the library is being modernized through automation/digitalisation. Number of cards issued to the students are as follows to facilitate borrowing of books.

Moreover, Journals and Newspapers are provided to the students & teachers in the Library reading room.

#### Departmental Library:

The college has the provision of departmental libraries to meet the immediate classroom needs of the departments which are maintained by the Heads of the departments. Students can avail the facilities of departmental libraries within the college hours only.

#### Book Bank:

Goreswar college book bank is opened in the College Library in order to provide text books free of cost to the BPL students. Rules and regulations regarding the book bank can be obtained from the Librarian.

#### Computer Lab:

A computer lab with 15 Computers and Internet connectivity which provides Computer Literacy and certificate courses in different programmes to the students of H.S. & TDC classes.

#### KKHSOU Study Center:

This Study Center is offering various courses such as BPP, BA, BCA and M.A. in three

subjects i.e. Assamese, Education and Political Science under K K Handiqui State Open University.

**Free Text Books:**

Free text books are provided to the students seeking admission in H.S. 1st year or TDC 1st Semester securing First Division/Star Marks/Distinction in H.S.L.C. or H.S. Examination.

**Xerox Facilities:**

Xerox facilities at concessional rate are provided to the users by the Library and IQAC of the college.

**Library Facilities to School Students:**

To extend the service of Goreswar College Library for the benefit of the school students of Goreswar Locality it has been arranged to keep the College Library and reading room open for the students of class IX and X on every Saturday from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

**Remedial Classes:**

Remedial coaching classes for students belonging to SC, ST, OBC and minority communities have been introduced from the session 2009-2010 with the fund provided by UGC. The same will be started in the current session also provided UGC grant is received.

**Coaching Classes for Entry in Services:**

UGC sponsored programmes to impart coaching to the students for preparing them to appear in competitive examinations seeking job opportunities are organized by the Cell for Coaching classes for Entry in Services. The facility is open to students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/Minority Categories.

**Career Counselling:**

UGC sponsored programme for preparing students for various examinations for employment in service and self employment are conducted by the Career Counselling Cell.

**Spoken English Class:**

In view of the growing needs of acquiring proficiency in communicative English, Goreswar College is providing Spoken English Course through the UGC sponsored coaching for Entry in service programme.

**Fee concession:**

With a view to attract brilliant students, 50% concession in Admission Fee (other than Tuition Fee) is given to the students seeking admission to either H.S. first year or TDC 1st semester Class if they have secured at least Star Marks in the qualifying examinations.

**College Canteen:**

The College has a canteen within its campus. It is supervised by a committee of Senior Professors and office staff. The canteen provides refreshment facilities to the students and the teachers of the college.

**GENERAL INFORMATION**

**Academic Session:**

The academic session 2017-18 starts on 1st July, 2017 to 30th June, 2018 in semester system and 1st semester ends in December 2017, 2nd Semester starts in January 2018, and ends in June, 2018. This is in conformity with the regulations of Gauhati University and Bodoland University to which the college is affiliated.

**Attendance:**

It is obligatory to every student to attend the classes punctually and regularly. Attendance of a student in the Degree Course must not be less than 75% of the total lectures delivered in an academic session. Attendance of a student in HS course also must not be less than 75%. Students Failing to maintain this standard will be treated as non-collegiate. Sending up of such students to final examination will be subject to approval of the Academic Committee of the College.

**College Hour:**

The working hours of the college is from 9-30 a.m. to 4-30 p.m.  
The class hours is 9-30 a.m. to 4-15 p.m.

**Identity Card :**

An Identity card is issued to every student at the time of admission. It shall contain information of the holder along with a recent passport size photograph duly endorsed by the principal. The student must keep it and should be ready to produce it whenever asked to do so. The

Identity card is not transferable.

**Students' Union:**

Goreswar College Students' Union is the General Body of the students of the college. All the regular students of the college are the members of this Union. The Principal of the college is the President of the Students' Union. If necessary the Principal may appoint an Asst./Asso. professor as the working president. Office Bearers of the Students' Union are elected by the students annually by an election held during the particular session. An election committee constituted by the principal conducts this election. The Election Committee consists of one teacher as Returning officer and three other members from the teachers for smooth conduct of the students' Union Election in every year. The Principal reserves the right to dissolve the Union Body at any time on disciplinary ground and constitute an ad-hoc body till fresh election is held.

**Suggestion Box:**

Any suggestion from the guardians/students/ well wishers related to development of the college may be provided through the suggestion box. Students/Guardians may express their grievances in black and white and drop it in the suggestion box. These grievances will be redressed by the concerned cell through discussion with senior faculty members.

**College Magazine:**

A college magazine named **Goreswar College Magazine** is published annually with a view to giving scope for expression of the literary and creative talents of both the students and teachers. Besides this a few wall magazines are also being published from time to time with short periodicity.

**Students' Aid Fund:**

The college has a special Aid Fund for financially poor students. This fund is created to encourage students from economically backward families who can't otherwise afford Higher Education. Entitlement to this facility is limited and subject to fulfillment of certain eligibility norms.

**Scholarship:**

There is provision for following categories of scholarships subject to fulfilment of eligibility criteria:

- i) State Merit Scholarship, National Scholarship
- ii) SC/ST/OBC/Tea Garden Labour Scholarship
- iii) U.G.C. sponsored scholarship for students of BPL category belonging to SC/ST/OBC and Minority Communities subject to the funding from UGC.

**Academic Calendar:**

All academic and Co-Curricular activities of the college are/ will be carried on as per the Academic Calendar of Gauhati University/Bodoland University.

**Support Services:**

N.S.S : The college has a unit of National Service Scheme which works, in co-ordination with the controlling authority in G.U./Bodoland University. It organizes various programmes all dedicated to community welfare in order to inculcate the sense of service to the nation in the minds of students.

N.C.C : The College has a full-fledged 1st A P Bn. NCC unit. A CTO is appointed by the College authority.

**CELLS & COMMITTEES:**

**Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):**

Goreswar College has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell. This Cell works towards creating an ambience of quality culture in the college. Formed in the wake of NAAC and UGC's nationwide call for quality assurance, quality sustenance and quality upgradation in Higher Education, this academic body has evolved an inbuilt mechanism for quality assurance in the college and is at present working sincerely for its execution.

**3. Extension Education Cell:** The Extension Education Cell was constituted in 2003. The function of the cell is to take the services of the college outside the campus. This cell organizes different social welfare programmes such as Environmental Awareness, AIDS Awareness, Health & Hygiene Awareness, Free Eye Check up Programmes etc. from time to time.

**4. Career Counselling and Guidance Cell:** The Career Counselling cell provides information to the students from time to time regarding the employment opportunities at various departments of the state and Central Government. In this way the cell helps the students to develop their career prospects for different competitive examinations.

Besides, a few faculty members of the college have successfully completed Minor Research Projects.

**Guest Lecture :** As part of the innovative endeavours the teaching departments of the college organise Guest Lecture programme by inviting experienced teachers from neighbouring Colleges to deliver lecture on various topics.

**Co-Curricular Activities :** The Co-Curricular activities have an important role for co-scholastic development of the students. Likewise, debates, quiz, music, fine arts, seminars, workshops which are organised in the college offer similar grounds to excel. Sports & Games is another significant dimension. Provision also exists for students to be deputed to various inter-college, inter-University, state /national level competitions in various fields.

#### **Adoption of Village :**

The village Barphukankhat under Betna Mouza of Baksa district, BTAD, Assam is adopted by the college in the year 2008 and the college imparts prime focus on most of the extension activities and programmes to transform it into a model village in due course. The college donated books & furniture to Barphukankhat M.E. School for the establishment of the library in the school for the benefit of the students as well as the local people.
